PARENT INSTITUTION:

It has well furnished and equipped laboratories, computer centers, library, Gymkhana, N.S.S., N.C.C. for the development of students. In addition, the college runs computer courses, short term courses, IBPS course and Competitive Examination Center for the better future of the students. The college also runs its own consultancy services and extension activities for the benefit of the students. alumni, stakeholders and local people.

CLASS ROOMS

The college has 51 eco - friendly class - rooms, with necessary educational amenities. Each Class room can accommodated about 120 students. Some of the class rooms have ICT facilities as per need of the curriculum and students. Smart Boards, Projector and OHP's are available for the students.

LABORATORIES

The college has separate laboratories well - equipped as per the curriculum of university. The departments such as Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Zoology, Electronics, Geography Statistics and Mathematics have laboratories. These laboratories are specious and well furnished with modern scientific instruments, equipments and other amenities. The regular access is given in these laboratories to the students and staff for their studies and research work

COMPUTER CENTRE

The institute has established well equipped 04 computer laboratories containing about 207 Pcs, 15 Laptops and 7 LCD Projectors. The computer center has all modern facilities of information technology including internet scanners and various types of printers. DTP, Tally, MS - CIT, etc. computer courses are run smoothly each year







LIBRARY

The college has separate library building. It is well equipped and computerized. The library has a profound collection of books, encyclopedia, journals, CD's and other resource material. It has valuable collection of total 72291 books for senior section. 29879 reference books, 42412 text books, 31 journals, various encyclopedi as, atlases, dictionaries and various newspapers are available for the readers. At the Reprography Centre, the students can photocopy and print papers at concessional rates. Book Exhibitions and orientation programmes for using Databases are arranged periodically. Library is enriched with competitive exam section, book bank scheme, new book arrival section, PPT Bank, Question Paper Collection, Nlist - Online E -Journals Facility etc. There is a well - equipped Special Reading Room Facility for staff & students. The College also has various departmental libraries used by the students in concerned departments. Guidance for INFLIBNET access, OPAC, providing question papers, syllabi, e - books, e - services, newspaper clippings, homelending, ready references, information services, photocopy, internal service and inter - library loan service is provided.

AUDITORIUM

HOSTEL

There is a separate provision of hostel for girls/boys. The Sharadabai Pawar Ladies hostel was estiblished in 2011 within college premises. Due to increasing number of faculties and courses, the total strength of girls and boys has increased considerably. Girl students from rural area, specifically those belonging to weaker sectio, discontinue their studies because of non availability of adequate hostel facilities. at reasonable cost, at places where our institute are located. Girl's hostel is able to enable and encourage girl student to attain quality education & to provide suitable, safe and inexpensive accommodation to girl students residing in places away from their hometown to be able to study. The capacity of hostel is 100 girsl. There are 40 rooms consisting bed, cupboard and fan in every room. Hostel provides accommodation, pure drinking water supply, hot water supply, study room, proper meal, equipped kitchen, dining hall, visitor's room, security etc.

The Boy's Hostel' is running well in Balwant College, Vita by staff management. The students who are needy and from 'earn and learn scheme' from the nearby villages of Khanapur Tehsil are taken admission in this hostel. There are 4 rooms and 16 students are admitted in this hostel. The basic and educational facilities are also provided in the college for the hostel students. The concession is given to the needy students.

CANTEEN

The canteen is very spacious and offers hygienic food at affordable rates. The canteen has lunch cum break fast available, mess facility for needy students, pure drinking water facility with separate seating arrangement for girls, boys and staff.

Chess. Carrom. Another special feature of Gymkhana is Multigym Machine for physical exercise. College Gymkhana regularly arranges sport competitions at University, Zonal and District Level. College has long history of achievements in sports competition from international level to zonal level. College also provides T.A. Track -Suits and other related faculties to the students for the participation in the various competitions.

SECURITY AND SAFETY

The College offers a very safe and secured environment with Close Circuit Cameras installed at all important places and round the clock security. 




NSS (National Service Scheme)


